




What is FeralCatScan?

- 1. FeralCatScan is a web and mobile App resource for landholders and the community to record feral cat activity, impacts and control actions.
- 2. Easy to use and free App for field data collection.
- 3. A central location for feral cat sighting and control data
- 4. Raise awareness of the scale of problems with feral cats
- 5. Bring people together in groups to work together, such as Landcare
- 6. Receive updates about feral cats in your local area.
- 7. Ongoing program and your feedback helps to improve FeralCatScan.



How to record feral cat activity

What FeralCatScan offers?

- 1. Website and mobile App (which works in remote areas).
- 2. Record sightings, evidence, damage and control activities.
- 3. Create maps of local feral cat problems.
- 4. Centralise your observations of feral cats.
- 5. Share that cat data with a contract trapper.
- 6. Join or create an online group for your landholder network.
- 7. Download the free Mobile App (Apple/Android) for recording feral cats quickly and easily with your phone.
- 8. Communicate current situation to the community.
- 9. Control data is **NOT** displayed to the general public.
