### Are Foxes causing problems in your local area?

Record information into FoxScan to help protect farmers and biodiversity.

**FoxScan is a free community resource for monitoring, mapping and managing foxes.** People are using FoxScan to record fox activity and coordinate local control programs. It can be used by landholders, community groups, local government, pest controllers and biosecurity organisations. ## Recording fox information in 4 simple steps

### 1. Select fox



From the app home screen select the fox image.

### 2. Select data type




Select either the 'Sightings' 'Damage' or 'Control' buttons to begin recording.

### 3. Answer the questions



The date and location will automatically appear. Answer all relevant questions.

### 4. Submit report



Upload a photo (optional) then select 'Submit'.
