Are Wild Rabbits causing problems in your local area?

Record information into RabbitScan to help protect farmers and biodiversity.

RabbitScan is a free community resource for monitoring, mapping and managing wild rabbits. People are using RabbitScan to record wild rabbit activity and coordinate local control programs. It can be used by landholders, community groups, local government, pest controllers and biosecurity organisations. Please read the instructions below to use the website, map and Phone App. Please print this information as needed.

The FeralScan App is available to download free-of-charge from the AppStore and Google play store. It can be used by anyone to record information about wild rabbits anywhere, including areas without mobile reception. Recording rabbit information in 4 simple steps

1. Select rabbit



From the app home screen select the rabbit image.

2. Select data type



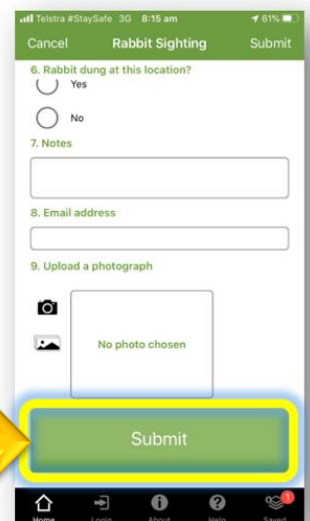
Select either the 'Sightings' 'Damage' or 'Control' buttons to begin recording.

3. Answer the questions



The date and location will automatically appear. Answer all relevant questions.

4. Submit report



Upload a photo (optional) then select 'Submit'.
